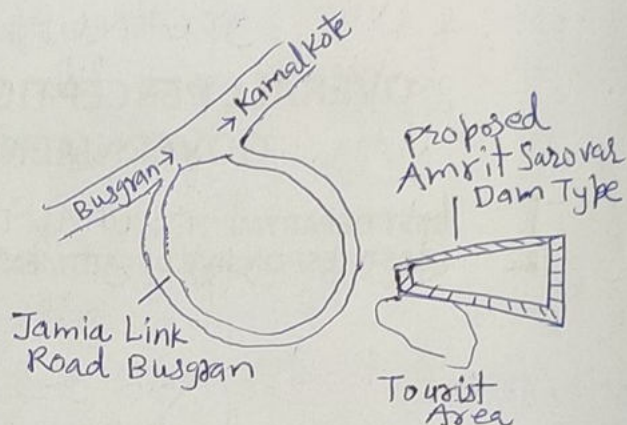

- Dhak Upper Busgran should be developed for eco-tourism as well as development of Amrit Sarovar.

Further, locally growing dwarf pomegranate cultivations need to be encouraged as a local bio-diversity product.



- Development and modernization of Jamia Link Road Busgran upto upper Busgran (Length 2.5 Km; pending work - 1.5 Km)
- The building developed (for Health Centre Busgran) on the donated land is relatively good and can be properly utilized as a Health care Facility but has been left without any tin sheets over the roof top, and thus is unutilized. The building has 6 rooms and 3 washrooms.
- Harnessing and supply of water ^{from} Safaidiyar Spring to Busgran will also ease drinking water problems for Dhani as well.
- Light Crafts Training centres by Handicrafts Deptt. (for imparting 1 year training in Sozni, Ari staple, crewel, Gabba, Zari, Wood carving, etc.) should be established at a feasible place in PH-2 Dachi at a feasible place for skill development.
- The irrigation system should be developed for agricultural self sufficiency.
- The available land (5 marlas) near Middle School Dachi should be procured for development as a school play ground.

- Procurement of 2-3 Kanals of land available near Middle School Upper Dachi for further expansion and development of a play ground.
- Compensation to landowners of MS Upper Dachi not done and needs redress.
- Slab & further raising of construction for the Middle School Upper Dachi needs attention.
- A sort of a mini-dam needs to be erected in upper Dachi to form an Amrit Sarovar.
- A school in Azeem Mohalla Dachi can be helpful due to accessibility and good location to cater many people.
- Compensation to all works done is immediately required.
- The main problems for schools is meagre staff, less space (need upgradation), no or less adequate play grounds, washrooms to cater different sexes. Procurement land is available at most places.
- Land available near High School Busgram needs to be procured as a playground on priority ~~as~~ because the school does not have any outdoor space for playing of children.

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
- Establishment of e-Browsing centre in the hall (measuring 24'x35') of High School Busgran to impart computer awareness and digital literacy.
- Dire need of class room furniture (Desks & seating) for High School Busgran should be provided.
- The High School Busgran is being run by the staff of primary school and lacks teaching faculty provided/allocated to High schools; & thus needs immediate attention.
- The primary school needs to be separated from the High School Busgran and developed elsewhere.
- PRIMARY SCHOOL DHANI (in ward 3) caters mostly to the people from low income group, and needs upgradation. About 20 Kanals of land is available and can be procured at a meagre cost for the upgradation of school to middle (and possibly to a High School in future) and development of the play ground. Compensation to landowner should be expedited & further procurement of available land followed up.
- Primary School Bagratto Busgran which is presently operated in a rented tin shed should be developed on the land available for procurement.
- Tendering issues of TJM Basgran project (Rs. 2.74 crores) needs to be resolved immediately. Contractors need to be encouraged for taking up the works.
- Adequate staff of PHE should be provided to resolve the drinking water facilitation issues, and piping works. Water distribution pipes should be installed at urgently needed locations.

- Hanging electricity supply lines over trees needs attention and installation of LT Poles is needed.
- Adequate PDD staff to cater to 11 wards of the halga Dachi.
- PHH ration cards for entire population is strongly recommended.
- 'Ladli Beti Scheme' for girl childs is highly recommended for the entire Uri Tehsil.
- Marriage assistance schemes need wider coverage.
- Establishment of a main building / centre for SHGs (Self Help Groups) for skilling and further provisioning of flexi-desks for business development to SHGs.
- Animal Husbandary & Veterinary clinics need to be developed.
- Health Centre Dachi needs upgradation and a spacious setting.
- Permanent building & manpower for IT Common Service Centre (CSC) for IT services.
- Panchayat Ghar rents should be provided to owners.
- Development of link road from Panj Peer to Khoyan between Magam & Khoyan.
- The land available in Ward 3 near Soki Dhanri village should be fenced and developed as a mini-park / playground. The available land is about 10 Kanals and needs no procurement/payments.
- About 35 marlas of land is available near rented Anganwadi Centre Dachi Radh which can be procured for permanent development of Anganwadi ICDS centre.
- A single Anganwadi centre should be provided / allotted to a single worker for proper effectiveness.

- Development of pomegranate and olive plantations at various places in Panchayat Halga Dachi.


