## GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. The visiting officer shall refrain himself/ herself giving or offering any commitment on behalf of the government and shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues. 6. Visiting officer should ideally carry his/her laptop to complete the reports at the panchayat level itself and upload the final report, duly signed both by the sarpanch and by the visiting officer on [www.jkpanchayat.in](http://www.jkpanchayat.in) portal, before they leave panchayat.

## MAHILA SABHA in Chewa

A Mahilla sabha was held today on 3rd April 2022 in chewa as an event of Back to village programme phase 4. The sabha witnessed strong participation by women of the said village. Nearly 40 women participated in the event and expressed their grievances with the hope of their swift redressal. Most women are distressed with the non availability of potable drinking tape water. Though the water pipelines are laid almost in the entire panchayat village but the non existence of a full fledged water scheme keeps the said village deprived of tape water most of time. This has created a crisis like situation in the village with women folk bearing the brunt of it as they have to travel to distant places to bring cans of water for domestic use. The women wanted swift redressal of this grave issue on priority. To ensure their safe movement in the evening hours the women demanded installation of street lights more so at the public places. In the Mahilla sabha the demand for identification and inclusion of more eligible beneficiaries under the PMAY was raised. Many of the participating women claimed residing in tin sheds but not having got benefit under the PMAY scheme as of now.

The issue of household toilets was also raised. The village is yet to achieve saturation in household toilets. Since most of the women in the panchayat are associated with Self Help Groups (SHGs), the women demanded that all members be provided skill training in relevant courses. The women also raised the demand for development of solid and liquid waste management system in the panchayat. The establishment of subsidized **Vermicompost units in the panchayat** was also asked. Improvement in the **condition of much deteriorated roads in the village** was also brought into the notice.

## Bal Sabha at CHEWA

A Bal sabha was held within the premises of the Govt Girls middle school chewa today on 03 November 2022 which saw enthusiastic participation by the school going children. The children raised a number of demands ranging from better facilities in the school and in the village as a whole. A children's park in the village equipped with necessary infrastructure was the top demand put forth by the participating children. The children also raised demand for establishment of a computer lab in the school. The children of the said school emphasized the need for earth filling of the school playground as it's top surface is laden with sharp pebbles and stones given the mountaneous terrain and soil in the area, which poses a threat to the safety and well-being of the children during games. The children also asked for better sports infrastructure in the schools including facilities for various other games besides cricket. The girl participants demanded that a separate wash room for girls be constructed in each school.

The participating children demanded that a play ground of standard be made in the panchayat village which would go a long way in creating a sports environment in the village. Lastly the students requested for making efforts to convert the village chewa into a clean and green village.

### Any Major complaint brought to the notice of visiting Officer

Three Grave complaints were brought to my notice.

1. Poor power infrastructure especially existence of wooden poles and standing trees for transmission of power lines. This poses a threat to the life and property of the public.
2. Shortage/poor availability of drinking tap water in the village as a whole and absolute shortage in Shaer colony. This is due to non existence of a water scheme in the village. Moreover poor pipeline infrastructure, non mantaince and non upgradation of water pipelines. This has resulted in a crisis like situation more so in sheer colony chewa. The whole village needs to be fully catered under JAL JEEVAN MISSION. On urgent and priority basis 2 bore wells should be constructed in Sheer colony chewa to mitigate the absolute water shortage.
3. Poor condition of inner link roads in the entire village. The condition is particularly tough for Sheer colony. A road

may kindly be constructed from main road chewa to Sheer colony.



Major/Urgent public demands that was/were reflected earlier but have not been addressed so far.

1. Macdamisation/ upgradation of link roads. This has been reflected and demanded since back to village 1 but has not been achieved yet. Though a small percentage of inner link roads have been upgraded but largely the picture of inner link roads and paths is deplorable.
2. Upgradation, maintainance of tap water pipelines to mitigate the poor availability and shortage of potable drinking tap water. This has also been demanded since the start but has not been addressed. As such the villagers are facing acute water shortage.
3. Installation of electric poles for power transmission in place of mostly standing trees and wooden poles. This demand was reflected on urgent basis but has not j addressed. It puts the life and property of the population to grave risk of fire accidents.
4. Relocation of HT/ LT transmission lines between Gulab sheikh Mohalla safapora and Jamia Masjid chewa.

The said electric poles and transmission lines are passing through marshy areas which don't possess the strength to hold the power line structure intact during snowfall or heavy rainfall in the winter. The damaged power lines then cut off electricity to the village Chewa for days altogether. The panchayat has put this demand of shifting the HT/LT line from the above said location to roadside. But this has not been conceded.

5. Renovation of the unsafe Govt boys middle school Takiya. This school poses threat to the life of staff and students. It has been consistently reflected but not acted upon.

6. Establishment of an Animal Husbandry centre. This has also been put previously but not dearth with by the govt.



## Overall Assessment of the visit and suggestions.

As visiting Officer of the Panchayat Chewa in Back to village programme phase 4, I along with sarpanch, panches and departmental supporting staff visited various locations in the village. I also held discussions with the local citizens, held Mahila Sabha, held Baal Sabha and Gram sabha and reached the following assement regarding the various parameters of the panchayat Chewa.

1. The major issue concerning and distressing the population is poor supply/ availability/ shortage of potable drinking tape water regularly in some wards and absolute non availability of tape water in other wards like Sher colony/Mohalla chewa. This is despite the proper laying of tape water pipelines in almost entire village. Reasons for such a poor state are attributed to non existence of a water supply scheme in the village or in near vicinity. In addition poor infrastructure, narrow pipelines, non upgradation and non mantainace of tap water pipelines is also an attributed reason. Implementation of JAL JEEVAN mission scheme can resolve this water shortage issue. Presently 2 bore wells may kindly be constructed in Sheer Mohalla to mitigate the absolute water shortage crisis.

2. Another grave issue which the public of Chewa village is facing is that of electricity supply. The power infrastructure in the village is very dismal. Wards like Sher Mohalla, takiya, laman , tengpora and few others don't have electric poles and durable wires for electricity transmission. The power wires are flown over trees and such other flimsy structures which pose a regular threat to the lives of the local population and their assets. Moreover the transformers are insufficient to ensure the power distribution in the entire village. As visiting Officer my suggestion would be that the power lines are flown over standard electric poles. The obsolete power wires should be done away with and replaced by strong and durable wires. In addition more number of transformers should be provided in the panchayat.
3. Pathetic and deteriorated inner link roads more so in Takiya chewa and sher colony chewa do a very poor reflection of the inadequate govt infrastructure building initiatives in the village. Tiling of footpaths, upgradatio, metalling and macdamisation of inner link roads, construction of new roads at some locations is needed in the village to build convenient and better connectivity. Construction of road from main road chewa to Sher colony is an utmost necessity.
4. The Govt boys middle school Takiya comprises of 3 deteriorated and unsafe rooms. The school is compressed in a very small area. There is no playground, no assembly hall.



Infact besides the 3 rooms which are in extremely bad shape and structure, the school has no infrastructure. The school has no fencing. The students offer morning assembly prayer on a small road portion, which is often halted as any vehicle comes. It is extremely disheartening and tearful for me as visiting Officer to see children forced to take education in such unsafe and deteriorated structures. The school doesn't offer any scope of repairment and expansion owing to its very small area.

As visiting Officer I request the higher authorities to kindly look Into this very sensitive issue and do the needful. As visiting Officer I felt the school needs to be shifted from its present place.

5. Numerous street lights need to be installed at various points in the village to ensure safety during night travel.
6. Work on construction of playground has not lead to creation of a properly finished project. The play ground needs further upgradation to make it fit for the sports activities.
7. Govt Girls middle school chewa needs a separate washroom for girls. It also needs earth filling of its play ground as the sharp stones and pebbles on the top ground surface pose risk of injury to the students during games.
8. The infrastructure of Govt boys high school chewa was overall found satisfactory upon visit. The school is also in possession of a large premises cum playground. The visiting Officer then met with the students and checked the

attendance on the day. The attendance of students of all classes was found pathetically dismall. Interacting with them the visiting Officer found that the understanding of the subjects by the students was extremely nill. There was no proper uniform dress code maintained by the students. As confirmed from the panchayat body and local public also the school has been performing very dismally over the years. Moreover parents don't prefer admitting their wards in the said high school. I as visiting Officer was highly disappointed with the state of affairs in the school.

My recommendation would be to hold the head of the school accountable for sad state of affairs of the school. Also I request that a committee be constituted who would take review of the school regularly.

9. A children's park has been developed near the health centre. However it is bereft of all the logistics which must be kept available in a children's park. My suggestion would be to upgrade the children park with needful facilities.
10. Most of the women in the panchayat are associated with Self Help Groups. There are 23 SHGs in the panchayat. My suggestion would be to impart skill training in various vocations to all the SHG group members.
11. Fencing of Graveyard at ward 4 needs to be done.
12. Culvert at Maltara needs to be constructed on priority basis



13. Anganwadi centres need to be established in Laman and sher colony.
14. The health and wellness centre needs to be upgraded with better facilities.
15. The irrigation canal from Bakshi Mohalla safapora upto Laman mohalla chewa needs laying of concrete lining walls. More so in the area between the land of Ghulam Qadir bhat to land of Ahad khan s/o.. shahbaz khan.

I certify that the visiting Officer Dr Irfan hassan parah stayed in the panchayat for 2 days and held various events of the back to village program phase 4. Gram sahba, Mahila sabha, Baal sabha were held. The visiting Officer also paid inspection cum visit to different govt institutions in the village during the 2 day B2V program. The Officer visited schools, CSC, Health centre, Anganwadi centre, PDS centre. The visiting Officer also visited the various development projects taken up by the panchayat during the last few years like Amrit sarovars, Individual Household Latrines, Soakage pits, MGNREGA roads, PMAY houses etc.




