GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. The visiting officer shall refrain himself/ herself giving or offering any commitment on behalf of the government and shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues. As far as possible, his/her observation should be based on a fair and analytical view emerging from his/her interaction in the village.

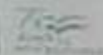

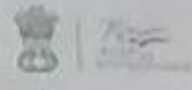

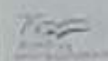

- Dispensary building, playground, Animal Husbandry Bank counter/ATMs, Rural Haat, Ration depot, are not available (Infrastructure deficiency)
- Unk roads (Internal) have not been taken up in many localities

*2. Long pending demand for const. of Bridge at Dudyal Mallah not yet been taken up.

- Upgradation of road from Chopra shop to Krimchy is also pending demand. Demand for changing the name of the school, Chak to Cpt Babu Singh Secondary school also pending.

*3. At the village / pvt. pop. is scattered and Unk roads have not been made which is the necessity for any kind of infrastructure development. There is a dire need for ration outlets, dispensary buildings & Banking counters/ATMs as the general public has to travel a lot for basic requirements. Proper lighting along the street has also not been made by the dept. concerned.

Suggestions:

Infrastructure development is suggested as there is a shortage of govt. buildings where the department officials can set up their offices. Door to Door garbage collection should

be introduced so as to maintain cleanliness
and thus creating healthy environment. As benefited
by the panchayat Sarpanch, Capt Babu Singh gave his free service
in working for 32 years and the present land on which school
is working also donated free of cost by him, it is demanded
by the Sarpanch & locals to change name school in his honour.
