### GENERAL ASSESSMENT OF THE VISITING OFFICER

I	Any major complaint brought to the notice of the Visiting Officer: ( Nil)
II	Major /urgent public demands that was /were reflected earlier but have not been addressed so far:- (Discussed in detail on previous pages.)
III	<p><b>Overall assessment of the visit and suggestions:-</b></p> <p>During the visit to the Panchayat, it was observed that people at large are satisfied with the functioning &amp; deliverance of most of the departments like Rural Development, Health, FCS&amp;CA, Social Welfare, Animal &amp; Sheep Husbandry, Agriculture, Horticulture, Education, Revenue, Labour, Public Works and PDD etc. They expressed satisfaction with regard to implementation of developmental programmes under different schemes like MGNREGA, 14<sup>th</sup> FC, PMAY, UT Capex, District Capex, LADF and Swach Bharat Mission etc and welfare schemes like Mid-Day Meals, National Social Assistance programme, Golden Cards, KCC, PMKISAN, Poshan Abhiyan, JSY, JSSK, OAP, DAP etc through which benefit reaches to the beneficiaries at grass-root level and on this account no major complaint was reported.</p> <p>The Online Services G2C initiated by UT administration that too in a time bound manner under Public Service Guarantee Act, are directly benefiting the people in general with regard to obtaining of various documents/Cards like Domiciles, Golden Cards, Certificates of different categories, Adhar Cards, E-Shram Registration Cards, etc, Scholarships/Pension under various Social Security Schemes. The impact of such Services is visible on ground resulting that the saturation level in many schemes in the panchayat is almost 100%..</p> <p>However, there are few grey areas also which need to be looked into viz :-</p> <p>(i) women participation in the Gram Sabhas and other programmes has been witnessed very low, as such women participation needs to be encouraged and emphasized to ensure that benefits of inclusive growth percolate down to all. More initiatives at panchayat level need to be taken to involve women in decision making processes through public meetings, &amp; gram sabhas.</p> <p>(ii) Though much has been done for the development of road connectivity, sanitation through SBM, mitigation of poverty through various Social security Schemes, etc however, attention requires to be paid towards Irrigation sector, power sector Solid waste management, providing of adequate drinking water and cleanliness and sanitation of the gram panchayat. Steps are also required to be taken for implementation of skill development programmes to better capitalize the available human resource and the stakeholder departments need to sensitize their field functionaries to make their presence felt at Grass root level and focus more on awareness and identification of the genuine and eligible prospective beneficiary</p> <p>(iii) The Un-utilised State/Kachharai land available in the gram panchayat needs to be developed into child friendly parks and playgrounds which could help to fulfill the ambition of 'My youth my pride' slogan.</p> <p>(iv) Since the area predominantly produces apples of various varieties due to its favourable climate, topography and soil characteristics and therefore in order to encourage the farmers in the trade and to improve their living standard, there is an urgent need of Cold Stores for which Private players are needed to be encouraged and providing timely marketing support for the produce besides establishment of Horticulture Zone in the Panchayat or any other adjacent Panchayat.</p>

	<p>(v) Most importantly, all the demands put forth by the public during earlier B2V Programmes, and not fulfilled yet were repeated during B2V4 also, therefore need to be given priority and fulfilled in a time bound manner.</p> <p>(vi) Lastly, Panchayat Bhawan with all the basic requirements is needed to be constructed for which sufficient State/ Kahcheria Land is available in the Panchayat. This will provide a platform for a vibrant Panchayat and for better co-ordination among the front line workers of all the stakeholders departments and for achieving the desired results. However, till Panchayat Bhawan is constructed and made functional, the abandoned / vacant building of GPS Vishkhal be used as panchayat ghar for the said panchayat</p>
