GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS





MAHILA SABHA

A Mahila Sabha was held in Panchayat Bhawan Danglepora on 03.11.2022, Thursday. About 45-50 women participated in it. Many issues relating to women were discussed. These included introduction of BETI BACHAU BETI PADHAV in Bandipora District, creation of more Anganwadi centres in Danglepora to envelope areas not already covered & provisions of craft centre in the village. Other demands included setting up of centres related to various trades in the Panchayat. The women also demanded Health Centre for the Panchayat. They also complained about unavailability of portable drinking water in the village.

BAL SABHA

A Bal Sabha was held on 02.11.2022, Wednesday within the premises of Middle School, Dangerpora. The children enthusiastically participated in the Sabha. A number of issues were raised. Among these were the lack of portable drinking water in the school & in the village in general, lack of drainage & sewage system in the village. The children also complained about non-availability of sports Infrastructure & equipments, lack of adequate classrooms etc. The children also demanded upgradation of middle school, construction of new building & a walk over bridge over the National highway adjacent to the school for students to cross the road safely. The issue of lack of well equipped laboratory was also raised. Awareness about drug abuse/addiction was also given to the students. It was brought to the notice that youth from different local areas visit most oftenly to the Sericulture building which is adjacent to school building for drug abuse and accordingly requested that strict action be taken against the addicts.
