



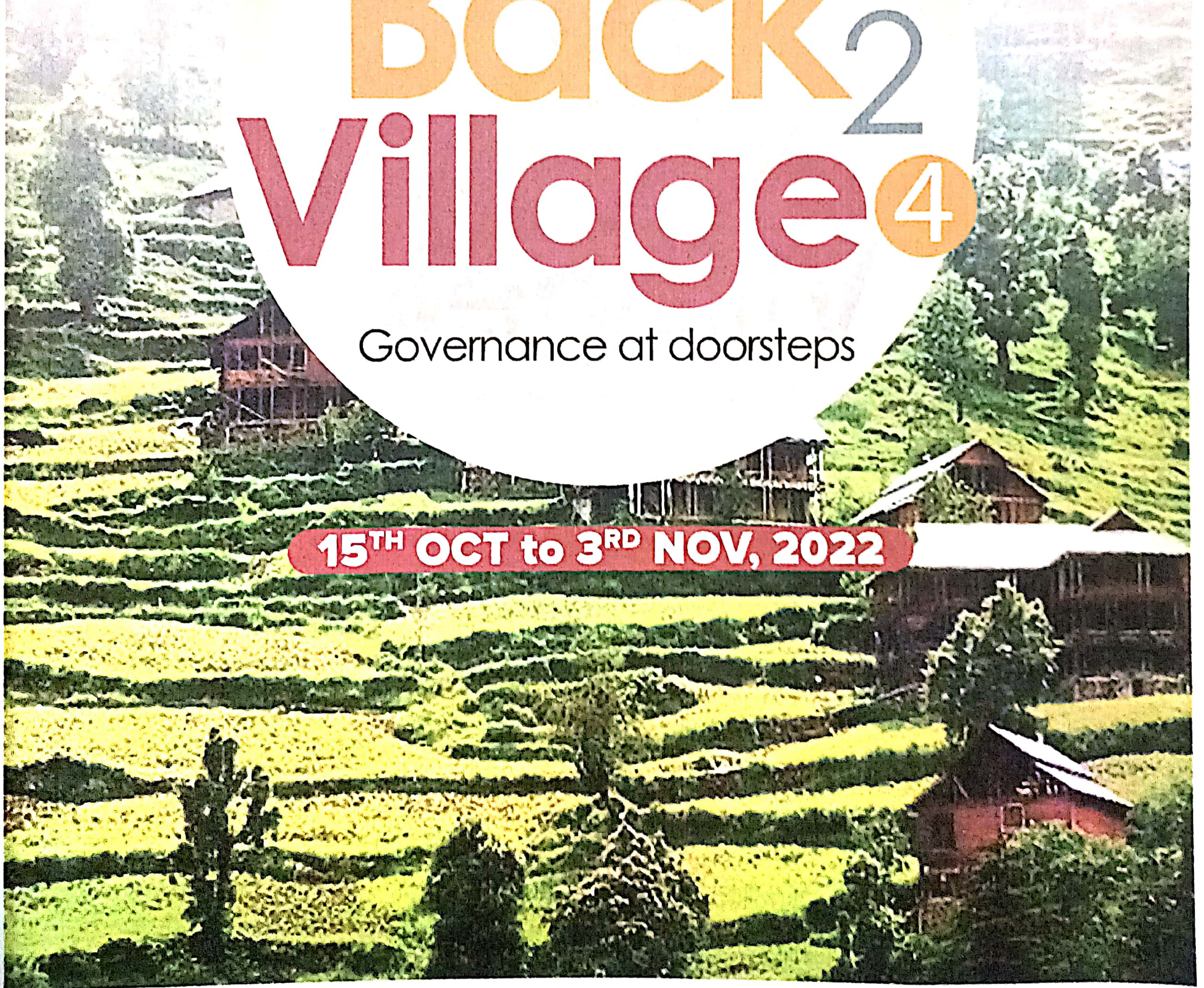

GENERAL ASSESSMENT OF THE VISITING OFFICER

I	Any major complaint brought to the notice of the Visiting Officer: The area being hilly People are facing problems in treating their Live Stocks as there is no any Hospital/Center or availability of any B.V.S.C Doctor in the whole vicinity.
II	Major/urgent public demands that was/were reflected earlier but have not been addressed so far: Construction of PHC and Veterinary/Animal Husbandry Hospital in the Gram Panchayat.
III	Overall assessment of the visit and suggestions: The overall area is hilly with rugged but beautiful terrain, the major village roads leading to Dist. H/Q have been constructed by PWD and PMGSY, the immediate thrust of both the departments should be to connect main roads taking off from Narsoo, Samrolie, Moud and Udampur via Upper Bali to the G.P. The internal ward to ward connectivity must be taken by RDD itself which is working in that direction. The main economic activity being the livestock's followed by agriculture both the areas can be improved if long pending demand of veterinary hospital and some kind of irrigation facilities are provided in the GP. The whole area is facing problem of drinking water as on date, but the concerned department has taken note of the same and a major W.W.S has been approved and tendered under JJM for the whole GP. Electric supply is satisfactory but some electric poles are needed which can improve the efficiency of the same. There are two Health Sub-Centers working in the area with only FMPWs who can provide first aid facilities, so the immediate demand of the public was the construction of one PHC with allopathic Doctors. The area is facing tremendous problem of ration distribution as there is not any registered public outlet in the GP, the same is being provided to the public through a contract system from Pyt Samrolie that too on paying the carriage. The SHGs are active in the area if provided with PSBs unit can give impetus to their economic activities and same was also demanded by the CSC unit functioning effectively in the area. Lastly, it is worth to suggest that the GP has a beautiful Upper reach namely Dhar Ladha which has tremendous potential for tourist attraction which needs to be developed by landscaping and road connectivity.
