GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. The visiting officer shall refrain himself/ herself giving or offering any commitment on behalf of the government and shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues. As far as possible, his/her observation should be based on a fair and analytical view emerging from his/her interaction in the village.
- 2. He is going to the village as planning officer, not for sanctioning any works or for making any commitments.
- 3. While preparing village development plan, he has to ensure that, demands are prioritized and reflected under available schemes, wherever necessary the larger works are to be referred to administrative deptt under CSS/UT plans under intimation to DCs and rest of the works to DCs for reflecting it under district/CSS plans
- 4. His work shall be hard core planning and audit and is not a PR exercise.
- Every Deputy Commissioner has to ensure that atleast one RDD official (ideally Panchayat Secretary) is present in every panchayat with relevant panchayat records, to ensure conduct of all activities as planned. Panchayat wise order needs to be issued in advance.
- Visiting officer should ideally carry his/her laptop to complete the reports at the panchayat level itself and upload the final report, duly signed both by the sarpanch and by the visiting officer on www.jkpanchayat.in portal, before they leave panchayat.
- 7. Focus of visit are youth, skills, self-employment, nasha mukt, bhrashtrachar mukt, Rozgar yukt J&K, besides to carry forward the activities during Jan Abhiyan and saturate them.

Overall Assessment/Observations/Suggestions

During the Back to Village-4 programme across the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, while visiting Panchayat Kalyanpur, it was observed that there is an ample participation of the PRI members and 'Back to Village' Programme has been instrumental in boosting understanding & awareness among the public, about the latest schemes & initiatives of the Govt. thus leading to a better public perception.

The 2-day visit of B2V4 in Panchayat Kalyanpur was a well-organised programme and it is very satisfying to see that well qualified staff is managing

the affairs of the Panchayat.

The interaction with the representatives of the Panchayat Raj Institutions (PRIs), local stakeholders and frontline workers of all the line departments, including Horticulture, Agriculture, Handloom and Handicrafts, ICDS, Industries, Social Welfare, among others was quite satisfactory. During the Gram Sabha, various issues and demands were raised by Sarpanch, Panches and general public of Kalyanpur Panchayat and stress was laid on people participation (Jan Bhagidari) in formulating the annual action plan. The timely monitoring of the ground works in line with deliverables set out during the 'Jan Abhiyan Programme' is very important so that the execution of development works is completed well-in-time and with the active involvement of the PRI members.

There is a scope for formulation of good tourism plan in this panchayat with an active involvement of departments of Tourism, Horticulture,, Irrigation and Flood Control, Youth Affairs and Sports. This panchayat has an ancient temple of Baba Jitto and Bua Kori at Jhiri, which is deeply revered by the devotees from Punjab, Haryana, Himachal, Delhi and other states besides the local populace. It has historical and religious significance and there is great footfall in the Jhiri Mela which is held during the month of October-November on "Kartik Poornima" every year. The Jhiri temple has a huge chunk of land associated with it and its status need to be preserved by demarcation of the lands which can be utilized for overall development of the area in order to make this panchayat a big tourist attraction. We can bring this Panchayat in the tourist circuit and Tourism Department can play a pivotal role in popularizing the tourist potential of the frontal border area.

In order to promote rural tourism, the visiting officer identified some trekking routes in the area in consultation with the Panchayat members.

There is need to build these tracking routes:-

1. Jhiri to Bawa Talab to Hari Singh Gharat Jhiri.

2. Jhiri to Chack Mani to Shama Chack to Baba Talab.

3. Jhiri to Pinjore to Shiv Dewla to Kana Chak to Mahavir Mandir.

4. Jhiri to Bawa Talab to Bawa Ki Janni to Burj mandir to Sui Temple to shivdwala(kana chak)

Stress was also laid for the registration of 'home stays' in the Panchayat area for the tourists and pilgrims visiting Baba Jitto temple Jhiri. This will in turn generate employment from rural/Agro/ religious tourism point of view.

The paintings of Baba Jittoo, Bua Kodi and Maa Vaishno Devi ji can be painted on the Compound Wall of GHSS Jhiri Compound wall depicting the folk lore of the region. Mural art with lighting can also be done on the walls surrounding Jhiri temple.

Apart from visiting Govt. Offices, Higher Secondary School, Anganwadi Centers, tourist places etc, it is found that Agriculture is the main source of subsistence for the population and it being a fertile land, the best varieties of Mango, Litchi, Guava and apple can be promoted and grown on commercial basis to increase the income of the farmers.

There is a need for upgradration of Sports field at Jhiri by leveling the whole ground, installing high mast lights and construction of jogging track. After interaction and feedback from general public during the informal meetings with senior citizens, youth, PRIs, etc. I would like to recommend the following demands which need early redressal.

1. Upgradration of Shamshan Ghat by raising the Compound wall.

2. Upgradration of Ladies Bathing Ghat near Shamshan Ghat.

3. Building of Panchayat Ghar should be well renovated with all the modern facilities and construction of culvert at Main road in front of Panchayat Ghar Gate.

4. Open Gym and children park at Jhiri.

5. Repair/renovation of Irrigation canals and its minor tributaries.

6. Improvement/beautification of surrounding areas of Jhiri Temple.

7. Improvement in the overall Drainage system.

8. There is a dire need of a proper sanitation plan for the proper waste disposal in and around Jhiri.

9. Utilisation of land near Shamshan Ghat at kalyanpur for making a vegetable market alongwith Cold Storage Plant.

The overall working of all line departments is satisfactory, it is exhorted upon the officers/officials to keep working with the zeal and zest and their ultimate goal should be to provide timely delivery of services to the local populace.

Since Jhiri is famous for its Annual Fair where people pay obeisance at the Baba Jittoo temple and seek blessings. Bua Khodi, a huge no. of tourist visit this site especially during this fair. The huge inflow of tourists can be tapped further to extend their stay by offering them a tourist circuit comprising of the temples of Sui & Burj known for their exquisite and elaborate wall paintings and metal idols of Shri Ram &Sita situated at a distance of just 5 kms away. Further they can be taken to Baba talab where people from all walks of life come to take a holy dip. After that the tourists can be taken to show the border areas which can promote the border tourism as well. So, Marh block can be offered as a separate tourist circuit with in Jammu region which is a mix of Heritage, Spiritual and Border Tourism as well. This will certainly increase the economic condition of the inhabitants of nearby kanachak border. Akhnoor, being just 10 kms from jhiri can become a viable destination from jhiri and the tourist can visit Ambaran buddhist site, and also enjoy the banks of Jia Pota Ghat. Along with their visit to Pandav Gufa and many other religious places.

Homestay registration Policy started by J&K Govt. dated 30-06-2022 offers nice incentives to those who start homestays.. In this context, several inhabitants of the area have set up home stays near the Baba Jittoo temple. Moreover, the department of Rural Development is also spreading the word and encouraging people of the area to convert at least one room of their house onto a home stay. This will definitely bring employment to the locals at their doorsteps and the youth of the area will get involved and would help in one way or the other in enhancing the economic condition of the locals.

Interaction With the Youth

Meanwhile, in the wee hours of the morning of Day-2, the Visiting Officer interacted with volunteers of Mission Youth and trainees undergoing 3- months C-Dyte Training Programme encompassing. Physical and academic training to appear in various competitive examinations at sports field, Jhiri, Panchayat Kalyanpur. During her address, she urged the young minds to choose the path of positivity and enthusiasm by shedding off fears of failure ,unemployment and hopelessness. She emphasized to adopt the Healthy Lifestyle and motivate the younger generation to work towards contributing the society by way of promoting national peace and brotherhood. A pledge regarding 'Nasha Mukt' Abhiyaan launched by Govt. of J&K UT was also taken with the youth besides participating in 'Run for Unity' event which acted as a motivating factor for the young aspirants.

BAL SABHA

Today on October 31, 2022 a Bal Sabha was held at GHSS, Jhiri in Panchayat Kalyanpur in the presence of visiting officer for B2V4, Ms. Sunaina Sharma Mehta, JKAS, Joint Director Tourism, Jammu. The Sabha was chaired by Sarpanch Mulkh Raj Sharma and attended by all the PRIs. The teachers at the School were also present and shared their valuable views and suggestions for student community. The proceedings of the Sabha are:-

- i) The visiting officer confirmed the availability of the facilities and Mid-Day meal in Primary school.
- ii) Children were asked to focus not only on academics but keep a balance between studies and physical activities, she directed.
- iii) The students were also made aware of the growing menace of drugs in the society and asked to stay away from drugs.
- iv) A pledge was also taken on developing a"NASHA MUKT BHARAT" and "Corruption Free Country".
- v) The students were encouraged to participate in some sort of sports activities, indoor or outdoor.
- vi) A Volleyball match, Lemon race and Blanket Volley Ball match was played by the students.
- vii) Lateron, "Certificate of Excellence" was also distributed among the brilliant students in different fields.

MAHILA SABHA

Today on Nov 1, 2022 a Mahila Sabha was held at Panchayat Kalyanpur in presence of visiting officer for B2V4 Ms.Sunaina Sharma Mehta, JKAS Joint Director Tourism, Jammu. The Sabha was chaired by Sarpanch Mulkh Raj Sharma and attended by all the PRIs. Ladies from SHGs, ICDS department besides Mahilas of the Panchayat attended it. The proceedings of the Sabha are listed below:

- i) The visiting officer stressed on how the role of women has evolved over the years and how they can contribute in building a healthy and better society.
- ii) Various schemes and Programmes run by the Govt. for pregnant and unemployed women were discussed during the Sabha.
- iii) SHGs were directed to involve more women either in the existing groups or by creating new ones to increase the number of earning women in the Panchayat.
- iv) Schemes related to Girl education were discussed to increase the enrollment of female students in the schools.
- v) The women present on the occasion demanded setting up of a packaging unit locally in the Panchayat. The visiting officer further directed the SHGs to look into the matter.
- vi) Need of more street lights was highlighted to reduce the number of dark spots in the panchayat to make it more women friendly.
- vii) Lateron, the visiting officer stressed upon holding such Mahila Sabhas more often so that the women in the panchayat can be empowered by involving every section of the Society.'
- viii) At the end of the Sabha, 'Gandhi Katha at Gram Level' was also held. The life of Mahatma Gandhi was discussed on the occasion along with the main teachings of Gandhiji. The need and relevance of Gandhian principles like non-violence, gender equality, women empowerment, abolish Casteism and Communal harmony were also discussed. The decentralization of powers to panchayat for strengthening the Panchayati Raj system and promote democracy at grass root level was also focused upon.
- Demo was given about Jan Bhagidari App, which will enable the general public for monitoring and overview of various works being executed by line departments under central or state sponsored schemes for meaningful transparency.
