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GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. The visiting officer shall spend at least three days in a Gram Panchayat to assess the details of the Gram Panchayat comprehensively.
2. He/She shall refrain from giving or offering any commitment on behalf of the government and shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues. As far as possible, his/her observation should be based on a fair and analytical view emerging from his/her interaction in the village.
3. He/She is going to the Panchayat as a planning officer, not for sanctioning any works or for making any commitments.
4. While preparing the Gram Panchayat development plan, he/she has to ensure that demands are prioritized and reflected under available schemes, wherever necessary the larger works are to be referred to administrative deptt under CSS/UT plans under intimation to DCs, and the rest of the works to DCs for reflecting it under district/CSS plans.
5. His/her work shall be hard-core planning and audit and is not a PR exercise.
6. Every Deputy Commissioner has to ensure that at least one RDD official (ideally Panchayat Secretary) is present in every panchayat with relevant panchayat records, to ensure the conduct of all activities as planned. Panchayat-wise orders need to be issued in advance.
7. The BDO has to ensure that Gram Sabha is held during the visit of the officer in the panchayat and uploaded on Vibrant Gram Sabha Portal.
8. The visiting officer should ideally carry his/her laptop to complete the reports at the Panchayat level itself and upload the final report, duly signed both by the Sarpanch and by the visiting officer on the www.jkpanchayat.jk.gov.in portal.
9. The focus of the visit is on youth, skills, self-employment, Nasha Mukti, Bhrashtachar Mukti, Rozgar yukt J&K, besides carrying forward the activities during Jan Abhiyan and saturating them.

In addition, attention may be given to the following areas:

- a. Make full use of Centrally Sponsored Schemes.
 - b. Saturation of individual beneficiary schemes.
 - c. Self-employment schemes.
 - d. Bank-linked schemes, including departmental subsidy schemes.

9. The PRI members (Sarpanchs, Panchs, BDC Chairperson) shall be at the forefront of all activities and given due importance, and the approach should be to strengthen them and make them feel empowered. He/she shall ensure that the BDC Chairperson and Sarpanch/Panch are present at the time of inauguration and ceremonies.

10. The visiting officer shall not leave the district without handing over a hard copy of the report to the Rural Development official (BDO/Panchayat Secretary) for further uploading of the report on the www.jkpanchayat.in / www.jkpanchayat.jk.gov.in portal within a week's time, positively.

Overall assessment of the visit and suggestions:

Back to Village (B2V) is one of the best initiatives undertaken by the Government of Jammu and Kashmir to make available Government at the doorsteps of the Rural Population to listen to them and put their genuine demands/grievances before the Government Jammu and Kashmir for redressal.

Government has provided the undersigned an opportunity to be part of this mission with the directions to visit the village/halqa assigned to evaluate and asses the developmental works/online services being provided in the village/Halqa Krenchoo, Pampore.

During the visit, it was observed that lot of works have been undertaken/executed by the line Departments like Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Social Welfare, Health and Medical Education, Youth Services and Sports, Power Development, Forest, Ecology and Environment, Revenue, Labour and Employment, Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, Horticulture, School Education, Food, Civil Supplies and Consumers, Jal Shakti and Finance/J&K Bank.

During analysis, it came to the fore that ~~100%~~ saturation has been achieved in the issuance of Golden Cards, digitalization of Jamabandi of the village has been done. Cent percent targets have been achieved in KCC, E-Sharm and PM Kissan Schemes, vaccination against Covid-19, regular immunization of children as per the government schedule is being done in the said village, etc.

Further, the undersigned participated in a number of events including sports, plantation drive, Nasha Mukht Abhiyan, Bal Sabha, Mahila Sabha, Gram Sabha/Gram Panchayat, organized in the village. Besides, visited various government offices and inspected the infrastructure available there after interacting with the staff. However, it was also observed that there are certain other aspects which need attention of the government, like dearth of staff in School and Government Degree College, up gradation of infrastructure and providing of sufficient staff in the NTPHC, unavailability of Patwari Khana in the village, besides, stress be laid on the cleanliness of the village.

I would like to congratulate the Government of Jammu and Kashmir for conducting such a holistic programme particularly for overall development of rural populace who enthusiastically participated and put forth their view point.

In view of above, the following recommendations are submitted for the consideration of the Government:

1. Incomplete projects/works be completed in a time bound manner and the under progress projects should be accelerated to ease out the hardships being faced by the rural population. Accordingly, the work on under progress project regarding the construction of DIET building at Zabdaji should be expedited.
2. CEO/ZEO be instructed to have fortnight visits to atleast one panchayat to assess the availability of basic facilities including, quality education toilets, drinking water, laboratory, library, kitchen and accommodation, being provided in the schools under their jurisdiction and submit their ATR to the Deputy Commissioner concerned for further course of action.
3. Since the villages are prone to floods/fash floods, and as a preventive measure, it is suggested that a Short Term Two Year Plan be introduced to ensure the execution of some immediate works including repairment of bunds of nallas/streams/canals so as to prevent the leakage into the fields and nearby residential houses to avoid great havoc from being caused to the life (including livestock) and property of the villagers.
4. Health and Medical facilities are not provided at larger scale to cater the needs of the villagers. It was observed during the visit that there is no dispensary in the Krenchoo village. Therefore, it is submitted that a dispensary be provided in the halqa to address the longstanding demand of the villagers. This may reduce the work load on the District and sub-District Hospitals too.
5. In order to generate more and more employment opportunities for the educated youth in villages and to make them self-dependent, it is suggested that at least one Trade and Skill Development Training Centre like repairing of electric and electronic gadgets, be established/installed in every panchayat to enable them to earn their livelihood.
6. Tourism Department should be instructed to develop Tourist and Heritage sites in a panchayat wherever available. This may also help employment generation and add to the revenue of the concerned village. According, it is requested that in Halqa Krenchoo shrine of Hazrat Syed Ibrahim Mantaqi^(R.H) situated at Dussu be brought on Tourism Map of Jammu and Kashmir and appropriate steps should be taken for its development as Tourist/Heritage Site.
7. In every Panchayat, a well-established and organized Public Library be installed to provide literature to the aspiring students/candidates preparing for the Civil Services and other competitive exams. Such steps may also help the educated senior citizens to grasp the knowledge and share their valuable thoughts and experiences of reading books with youth population of the village in order the inculcate the habit of reading books among them.

8. In every Panchayat, two youth (male/female) with science background at 10+2 level should be given Medical Laboratory Technician Course Training on subsidy basis, so that the villagers should get their primary tests like Urine examination, blood sampling, ECG etc. done at their doorsteps and that too at low costs. This will save their precious time and may amount to one more source of employment generation in the village.
9. Each Administrative Secretary should adopt atleast one Panchayat, to visit on monthly basis to have firsthand information about the developmental works being carried out in the concerned panchayat and may issue immediate necessary instructions as may deem fit in the circumstances and may file their ATR to the Government for further course of action.
10. Government should arrange day visits of women/Children/youth to the Government/Semi-Government/Public Sector Undertakings in the nearby cities to enable them to imbibe the work culture in them, so that they can share their first hand experiences with the local populace back in the village.
11. Since the villagers are mostly agriculturists and may not be having appropriate knowledge about the agriculture activities to be carried out in the fields. Therefore, it is necessary in every panchayat one Agriculture Sub-Centre be established where training regarding basic agricultural activities and hybrid seeds are made available to the villagers at their doorsteps under one roof. On the same analogy, Horticulture Sub-Centre may also be established in every panchayat.
12. Since, all the Government Departments are carrying out the developmental works in coordination and cooperation with each other, however to my understanding there should be some sort of supervision/monitoring over on overall developmental works/activities being carried out in a village. Accordingly, it is submitted that a Monitoring/Supervisory Mechanism of officers/officials from Departments of Rural Development, Planning and Monitoring, Finance and General Administration, besides, respectable senior citizens and panchayat members be established to monitor/supervise the activities being carried out in the village.
