It is surprising that despite having abundant livestock, local food products like maize, walnut etc., they never have availed the subsidy based loans or high density crops or high breed livestock due to lack of awareness or lack of access, which would definitely have enhanced their production process. If approached by the concerned departments and given hassle free monetary support or high breed animals they would definitely help in reducing the food scarcity not at regional level but also at the national level.
