① Upgradation of school :- This school is established in 1958 and is one of the oldest school in Karnah. Unfortunately it has observed stepmotherly attitude from administration and still not been upgraded to high school.

② Poor Infrastructure :- School have one building with only 4 rooms. Accommodating 11 classes in 4 rooms is not only inconceivable but also has an effect on imparting quality education to students. Therefore it is requested to kindly intimate higher ups to build 2nd story on the existing school building.

③ Felling of walnut trees :- There are three walnut trees within the lawn

of school. There is always been a fear of falling of these trees on school building during wind storms or heavy snow. If happens so will lead to loss of life of students/staff or may damage the building. This issue has been taken to local administration a number of times but no serious effort is made in felling these trees. Moreover it was submitted in written to worthy SDI Karamah that any damage caused by these trees to life of students/staff or property of school, administration will stand responsible for that.

Therefore you are impressed upon to take this issue with local administration and intimate them to initiate a serious effort in felling of these trees.
