- 1) Road connectivity should be ensured to the people as even this age of development people are living ^{life} ~~age~~ of misery and hardship.
- 2) People of the area don't have much employment avenues available in the panchayat. The village is not even self sufficient with respect to agricultural production.
- 3) There is a perennial nallah flowing in the area which is having considerable discharge. The nallah may fulfill the criteria of hydropower generation. The govt should start preliminary surveys for mini hydropower plant if found feasible.
- 4) The developmental activities going ⁱⁿ the panchayat is not at par with the pace in the contemporary world.
- 5) There is huge shortage of staff in educational institutions.
- 6) Funds available with the panchayat are not sufficient to carry out developmental activities.
- 7) Irrigation and Flood control department should increase its developmental activities as the perennial nallah has turned the area into slide prone especially in ward no. 4 (Kalapahar).
- 8) School going children are leaving the schools mid way and prefer to ~~live~~ reside with parents in pastures where they involve themselves in farming activities, this is primarily because parents are not even able to provide basic facilities to their children because of poverty.
- 9) ~~So~~ Overall hygiene of schools / students unsatisfactory. Govt should look into the miserable situation of school going children.
- 10) Transport in the area is almost zero.
