	1	<u>Construction of bridge:</u> A wooden bridge over Jehlum River connecting Naninara with Sumbal was declared unsafe in the year 2013 and was subsequently dismantled in the year 2014. Construction of new bridge was taken up in the same year i.e 2014 by R&B Department. However during 2014 flood the work on the said bridge got hampered and till date the work to construct the bridge could not be restarted. The UT Government should take serious steps for re-starting of construction work over Jehlum River bridge connecting Panchayat Naninara with Sumbal as in absence of this bridge has undoubtedly caused significant hardships for the residents. It disrupts daily life, impedes accessibility to essential services and hampers economic activities. Addressing this crucial issue would not only alleviate the suffering of the community, improve the resident's quality of life but also stimulate local development and connectivity.
	2	<u>Establishment of Playground:</u> In absence of a Play ground poses a challenge to the community, limiting opportunities for physical activity, recreation and organized sports events. Establishing a dedicated Play ground could significantly enhance the overall well-being of residents, fostering a healthier lifestyle and community engagement. It is suggested exploring possibilities for construction of sports facilities could promote unity, wellness and a sense of pride among residents.
	3	<u>Establishment of Public Health Centre:</u> It would be in the fitness of things to establish a separate Public Health Centre in Naninara Panchayat as presently the panchayat is being catered from adjacent H&WC Panchayat Nesbal. This critical issue requires the support and intervention of the

		government to establish a separate health centre in Naninara panchayat that would address the growing healthcare needs/services of the local population at the convenience.
	4	<u>Re-construction of School Building:</u> The pressing issue that requires the government's intervention is the urgent need for the reconstruction of Government Girls Middle School, Naninara building. The existing school building has suffered significant structural damage during 2014 flood, compromising the safety of students and staff. The current infrastructure is also insufficient to meet the growing needs of the student population, resulting in overcrowded classrooms and inadequate learning spaces. The deteriorating condition of the building poses a safety risk to students, teachers and staff, requiring immediate attention and intervention.
	5	<u>Establishment of ATM :</u> Placement of ATM in the Naninara Panchayat which would provide the residents with convenient access to banking services, reducing the need to travel to distant locations for basic transactions.
