#### ii. FEEDBACK ON UT INITIATIVES

The masses are very much excited about initiatives taken by the UT Administration. The has been drastic reduction in the corruption and all works are being taken through e-tendering. Further the Jal Jeevan Mission is a grand success in the Panchayat. The beneficiary under different centrally Sponsored schemes are availing the benefits but the locals complained that there is lack of awareness among the masses and Department should take initiative in this regard. The masses and PRI are also satisfied that after implementation of the Panchayati Raj Act, each Panchayat is getting its share of the development through allotment of funds through different schemes.

		Overall assessment of the Panchayat is good. The participation of the locals was good but not upto the mark. The Gram Sabha was attended by the PRIs and locals. The frontline staff of the Department also participated in the Gram Sabha. The locals showed disappointment over the non fulfilment of the some of the demands of the Back to village programme reflected earlier but very happy also that some of their demands have been addressed with respect to water connectivity and internal connectivity. The condition of the schools operating in the panchayat is not good and requires immediate repair and renovation which has not been addressed till date. 4 lacs were sanctioned for PS Balli but got lapsed. There are two schools operation from the private building PS Chakwa and PS Kundi but the situation is same. 12 lacs were sanctioned under SSA 10 years back but that got lapsed due to land assue. There is need of construction of the new school buildings or these schools can be merged with the existing schools. The tractor load from Azundhan to Sildhar is addressing the issue of the internal connectivity of ward no. 2, 9 and proposed tractor road from Kundi Galli to Kurshalla shall provide connectivity to almost

		50 % of ward No. 8. But still ward No. 7, majority of 8 and 4 have connectivity issue which needs to be addressed. There is requirement of HT and LT poles in the area but till date only 18 No. HT poles have been provided. In ward No. 2 there is proposal of installation of transformer but it has not been installed and 10 poles and construction material has been dumped. There is need to 25 KV feeder at Rajgarh to 63 KV feeder. There is only one Sub Centre of Health Department at Kundi and is operating from Private building. There is need to construct building of the Health Centre and deployment of the more staff. There is only one CSC Khidmat Centre at Karol and a lot of population from upper reaches are not able to reach. There is need of opening of a new CSC centre at Sildhar. The Panchayat is having no JK Bank extension counter/ATM in the Panchayat and the locals are suffering a lot. There is need to open Bank counter at Karol or Sildhar. There are two Ration Depot in the Panchayat but both are operating from private building. There is need to construct Building. The existing Karol Kumate Road under PMGSY has not been passed for plying the transport buses/Mini buses which needs to be addressed as the locals are suffering a lot. Kundi Kul is non functional which needs to be repaired and maintained by the Flood and Irrigation department. The Irrigation canal has potential to increase the agricultural productivity of the Panchayt. The Panchayat has rich potential of Anardana, Oleo, Mushroom cultivation, Mulberry etc which can be harnessed through involvement of Agriculture, Horticulture, Forest, Sericulture Departments. There is lack of awareness of the beneficiary oriented Schemes at the ground level and the concerned Department has to take lead for their awareness and implementation.
