1. To hold meetings with PRIs, Officers/officials of the department, and General Public to have firsthand information about the Infrastructure & implementation of Schemes as per Schedule 1A, 1B & Schedule-II.
2. Ensure that all front line workers of different deptts are present.
3. Ensure exhibition by different depts. about individual beneficiary schemes.
4. Inspect JKB/PSB counters/outlets.
5. Participate/ensure organization of sports activity in playfield, talent hunt cultural event/youth activity.
6. Ensure awareness generation about PM Vishwakarma scheme and AyushmanBhav.
7. Ensure saturation of soil health card and Golden Health Card under AyushmanBharat, saturation of Old Age Pension Scheme, Domicile Saturation, KCC Saturation, and saturation of land passbooks.
8. Visit government establishments, i.e., Health facility, Education Institute, Aganwadicenters, CAPD store, Bank/Extension counter, Amrit Sarovar, Playground, PatwarKhana, etc.
9. Inspect Khidmat (CSC) Centres and create/generate awareness on online schemes, especially G2C schemes like BEAMS, Janbhagidari, Aapki Zamin Aapki Nigrani, Digital J&K, etc.
10. Check effectiveness of centrally sponsored schemes through field visits of PMAY houses, Compost/Soak pits, JJM, etc.
11. Assess status of connectivity, Transport, Electrification, Drinking water, cleanliness, etc., in the panchayat.
12. Wherever possible, distribute employment letters for people selected under various government employments.

14. Prepare Village Development Plan, in consultancy with Gram Panchayat, discuss it in Gram Sabha, and get it approved.
15. Identify unique features of the Panchayat in terms of Tourism, Culture, Heritage, Potential, etc.
16. Organize village-level cultural events to engage panchayat members.
17. Obtain a candid assessment about the performance of various deptts, including fair feedback about discrepancies in functioning.
18. Open discussion on Nasha Mukta Abhiyan, corruption-free Panchayat, etc.
19. Assess the progress of different schemes relating to the localized SDGs prioritized for that village as per the resolution passed by that Gram Panchayat.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. The visiting officer shall spend at least three days in a Gram Panchayat to assess the details of the Gram Panchayat comprehensively.
2. He/She shall refrain from giving or offering any commitment on behalf of the government and shall adopt an unbiased attitude in reporting issues. As far as possible, his/her observation should be based on a fair and analytical view emerging from his/her interaction in the village.
3. He/She is going to the Panchayat as a planning officer, not for sanctioning any works or for making any commitments.
4. While preparing the Gram Panchayat development plan, he/she has to ensure that demands are prioritized and reflected under available schemes, wherever necessary the larger works are to be referred to administrative deptt under CSS/UT plans under intimation to DCs, and the rest of the works to DCs for reflecting it under district/CSS plans.
5. His/her work shall be hard-core planning and audit and is not a PR exercise.
6. Every Deputy Commissioner has to ensure that at least one RDD official (ideally Panchayat Secretary) is present in every panchayat with relevant panchayat records, to ensure the conduct of all activities as planned. Panchayat-wise orders need to be issued in advance.
7. The BDO has to ensure that Gram Sabha is held during the visit of the officer in the panchayat and uploaded on Vibrant Gram Sabha Portal.
8. The visiting officer should ideally carry his/her laptop to complete the reports at the Panchayat level itself and upload the final report, duly signed both by the Sarpanch and by the visiting officer on the www.jkpanchayat.jk.gov.in portal.
9. The focus of the visit is on youth, skills, self-employment, Nasha Mukti, Bhrashtachar Mukti, Rozgar yukt J&K, besides carrying forward the activities during Jan Abhiyan and saturating them.

In addition, attention may be given to the following areas:

- a. Make full use of Centrally Sponsored Schemes.
 - b. Saturation of individual beneficiary schemes.
 - c. Self-employment schemes.
 - d. Bank-linked schemes, including departmental subsidy schemes
 - e. Empowerment and transparency through digital initiatives

9. The PRI members (Sarpanchs, Panchs, BDC Chairperson) shall be at the forefront of all activities and given due importance, and the approach should be to strengthen them and make

them feel empowered. He/she shall ensure that the BDC Chairperson and Sarpanch/Panch are present at the time of inauguration and ceremonies.

10. The visiting officer shall not leave the district without handing over a hard copy of the report to the Rural Development official (BDO/Panchayat Secretary) for further uploading of the report on the www.jkpanchayat.in / www.jkpanchayat.jk.gov.in portal within a week's time, positively.

As such it is suggested that:</p> <p>A) The Pyt has been observed to be the natural habitat of the Khair Wood(Katha) plant which has also been found growing amply even in the agricultural fields of the farmers. Since, this plant is of much Economic importance and has multifarious utility in Pharmaceutical, Cosmetics, Food Industries etc . At present , the wood of this tree is being sold out by these farmers at very high cost to the contractors to earn their livelihood. Thus, natural habitat of Khair Wood Plant of the entire for Pyt can be exploited commercially by converging it with the schemes of the forest department and forest department can be roped in to provide the seedlings to the farmers along with other benefits to encourage the farmers for growing this plant commercially so that the standards of the living of the people is improved</p> <p>B) There are ample no. of Bowali's and ever flowing Nallahs in the entire panchayat which can be exploited to provide the source of irrigation to the agriculture sustainability of the panchayat by constructing check dams over these Nallahs and further construction of Khools in the village to reduce the dependability of the agricultural crops on the rainfall. One such demand was also raised during the visit of the u/sd that construction of check dam on Bhag nallah at Bhag point of the village with further construction of two khools vertically on both sides of Panchayat to provide the irrigation facilities to the farmers . By construction of check dam or micro watershed projects, at least 50 -100 families of the village can be benefited directly which may change the scenario of the Pyt. Similarly, there are many other small nallahs and Bowali's which can be exploited for the purpose of providing assured irrigation to the farmers</p> <p>C) The farmers of the village should be encouraged to adopt Dairy Farming and sheep rearing to raise their income standards as the area is amply enriched</p>

D) Introduction of the Bamboo cultivation on large scale and its allied product can also lead to increase in the income of the farmers of the area, as the same has also been found native in the area.

E) Most important requirement for any area to grow economically is the existing system of connectivity and the communication in the area and from both angles, the entire Pyt is poor in status. Inter and intra connectivity of the villages/ morhas/ wards of the Panchayat is only through Kacha / tractor roads only and on the other hand the telephone / mobile signals are also not available in the area. The u/sd totally remained cut off from the outside world during the stay in Panchayat. Only one Mobile tower of AirTell company is exiting there that too is having poor signal quality. The internet facilities were not there in the Panchayat Ghar it self. At least one Mobile towers of BSNL and JIO Fibre along with the Land Line facilities to the Panchayat shall ease out the life of the public in general and younger generation/ students/youths in particular.

In order to strengthen the firms financially ,the Sarpanch and other members of the Pyt suggested that there should be divisibility of the resources i.e. Funds/Income between the Panchayat and the concerned departments like Revenue, Forest etc. realizing Revenue on account of fees/duties being charged for providing various services/certificates to the public of the Pyt etc.
