

### DC Kathua presides over block diwas proceedings at Marheen



KATHUA, JULY 13: To listen and redress the grievances of common masses, Deputy Commissioner Kathua Rahul Pandey today convened a Public Outreach Camp here at Royal Farms, Chadwal in Marheen block.

During the camp, PRIs projected the issues of public importance and sought immediate redress of the same.

Issues ranging from non functioning of tubewell at Chack Changa, restoration of SRTC Bus service to connect border villages, completion of Karol-Pahadpur GRF Road, commissioning of CSC at Sanji Morh, submission of DPR for KV School, filling of vacant post of Technician for Ultrasonography at CHC Hiranagar, resolving the problem of low voltage and unscheduled power cuts, up-gradation of receiving station Chhan Rorian etc.

Besides, demand for mini secretariat building was also raised by the locals.

The demand for opening of public library and provision of a guest house for Tehsil Marheen was also projected by concerned PRIs.

After giving a patient hearing, the DC directed departments to ensure on spot resolution of the grievances raised by the people.

Responding to the demands, the Deputy Commissioner said the issues requiring intervention of district administration shall be disposed of in time bound manner, while those involving policy matters shall be taken up at appropriate Forum.

The Department of ICDS and Animal Husbandry set up stalls at the venue of Public Outreach Camp to aware the people about their schemes and programmes.

SDM Hiranagar, XEN PWD, Chief Medical Officer, Chief Education Officer, Officers of various departments, Panches, Sarpanches and a large number of people were also present.

Similarly, Block Diwas proceedings were also held at Basohli and Billawar sub divisions.

During the visit the DC reviewed basic facilities available to public and also inspected ongoing work of flood spill channel.

He said some new equipments has been provided to NTPHC for smooth functioning and for providing best Health care facilities to public.

During the visit, the DC also inspected various ongoing developmental works and directed the concerned to enhance the pace of work for timely completion of projects.

He urged the PRIs to take review and keep track of developmental works in order to complete the works in stipulated time.

Regarding under construction Naidkhai Bridge, Dr. Owais said that all the bottlenecks in the construction of bridge has been removed and all other remaining work will be completed within days for making the bridge functional.

The DC on the occasion also interacted with genral public and PRIs to take feed back of various services and developmental works.

People of the concerned areas presented various issues before the DC who assured redressal of all genuine grievances on priority.

### Block Diwas: DDC Rajouri presides over public outreach camp at Rajnagar, Budhal

RAJOURI, JULY 13: To redress public grievances at their doorsteps, the District Development Commissioner Rajouri, Vikas Kundal today chaired a public grievances redressal camp organised as a part of weekly Block Diwas here at Rajnagar, Budhal.

Among others present were BDC Budhal New, Shamin Akhter; ADC Koteranka, Surinder Mohan Sharma; CPO, Mohammad Khurshid; SE Hydraulics, JP Singh; LDM, Jyoti Prakash; DSWO, Wakeel Ahmed Bhatt; ARTO, Shami Kumar and other District and sectoral officers were present during the event.

During the event, the public and their representatives raised a number of issues and demands of their areas including macadamization of roads, upgradation of Govt institutions, paucity of staff, better health care facilities etc. Specific issues included completion of work on Conference Hall at PWD Dakbunglow, shortage of staff at PHC Budhal, ultrasound machine to be sanctioned for PHC Budhal, road from Kewal to Targain, road Samote to Bagla to be blacktopped, paucity of staff in educational institutions etc. Some more issues were implementation of Jal Jeevan Mission, scarcity of water, construction of BDO office building, repairing of Gangota bridge, post of NT at Niabat Budhal to be filled, dilapidated condition of road from Rajnagar to Ghabar, construction of road from Samote to Rangbagla, shortage of staff in Govt HSS Ghabar etc.

Officers of different departments also brifed the public about the status of a number of schemes being implemented in the district and motivated them to avail the benefits of the same. They also responded to the queries pertaining to their departments raised by the public during the event. While replying to the issue of scarcity of water, the SE Hydraulics informed that as many as 11 schemes worth Rs 51.88 crores have been approved for the block under Jal Jeevan Mission.

The DDC gave a patient hearing to all the issues projected by the public during the event and assured them that all their genuine concerns would be redressed in a phased manner. In his address, the DDC said that the District Administration is making untiring efforts to redress the genuine concerns of the public and sought the active cooperation of all the stakeholders in this regard. He also said that effective measures are being taken for the inclusive, all-round and substantial development of all the areas of the district and much emphasis is being laid to push every sector to take the district to newer heights and new levels of prosperity. While enumerating several Govt schemes and programs meant for the welfare of the general public, he urged the people to come forward and avail the benefits of the same.

Stating that close coordination between the frontline workers and public representatives is a must for the overall development of the region, he asked them to work in tandem for the prompt delivery of essential services and holistic and sustainable development of the region. Highlighting various schemes of the Mission Youth, he also said that the Govt has launched a number of initiatives to meet the aspirations of youth so they can contribute to society and achieve self-growth. He asked the concerned officers to publicize the schemes and their benefits so that the maximum number of target population could take benefits out of the schemes under mission youth.

While addressing the issues and demands of the general public, he also exhorted the officers to take immediate measures to mitigate the problems of the people highlighted during the public outreach programme. He also assured the public that all their grievances have been documented and all their genuine concerns would be redressed in a phased manner with the intervention of the concerned quaters.

Asking the officers to work with promptness and problem-solving approach, the DDC also asked the concerned officers to gear up their field machinery and ensure that the difficulties of the people are addressed and resolved at the earliest.

### DDC Chairman Doda, DC other district heads listen to public grievances

DODA, JULY 13: District Administration Doda, in its efforts to resolve the public grievances at people’s doorsteps as part of weekly block Diwas programme, District Development Council Chairman Dhanantr Singh Kotwal, Deputy Commissioner, Vikas Sharma and several other teams of officers today conducted public outreach programmes across the district.

This Wednesday Block Diwas program was held at Government High School in Panchayat Kharangal, (Gandoh), Madhai Park in Middle Sharote, (Thathri), PWD Guest House Kurmail, (Assar), High School Manthala, (Bhaderwah) and Panchayat Goha Marmat.

The District Development Council Chairman and the Deputy Commissioner took stock of public grievances at Manthala, Bhaderwah. They interacted with PRIs and the public. A number of demands/ grievances were put forth by the PRIs and general public. On the issue of water shortage and other issues concerning Jal Shakti department, the SE Hydraulics was instructed to visit the area within a week along with concerned Ex En to resolve the genuine public issues. Responding to the demand for an ATM and a Bank branch in the area, Cluster Head JK Bank was asked to check the feasibility as per the bank norms and submit the report. The locals were further assured to take up the demand for installation of a telecommunication tower to resolve the poor network problem with the service providers. The concerned officers were directed to pay in time the land compensation acquired for various developmental projects and the wages to the daily rated workers engaged by different departments.

About the Damunda to Jai Road link and Circular road, the PWD and Forest department were directed to clear all the formalities in one week to facilitate the early execution of the work. The Food and Civil Supplies Department was asked to report the decision of the administrative department on submission of a technical feasibility report for the establishment of Food Stores at Kansar and Thuba.

The DC directed the district heads to review the action taken on public grievances raised during the Block Diwas programmes quarterly so that the genuine issues were addressed in a time bound manner.

The DDC Chairman, while responding to the public issues, appealed to the PRIs and the public to Cooperate with administration to attain collective and inclusive development in the district.

At other designated locations which included Panchayat Kharangal, (Gandoh), Madhai Park in Middle Sharote, (Thathri), PWD Guest House Kurmail, (Assar) and Panchayat Goha Marmat, the day long Block Diwas proceedings were attended by a large number of people and local PRIs.

The Public and PRIs put forth a range of issues and demands. They demanded augmentation of water supply and electricity, macadamization of roads, meeting dearth of staff in schools and hospitals, upgradation of schools, banking facilities in rural areas, release of pending wages under MGNREGA etc.

The Presiding officers of the Block Diwas gave patient hearing and directed the concerned officers to prepare a list of issues/grievances raised pertaining to their departments and resolve the same at an earliest.

As many as 102 grievances/ applications were received at all locations out of which 97 were disposed of on the spot. Besides, 20 Domicile certificates, 02 Category certificates, 05 birth/ death certificates were issued to the eligible beneficiaries. Four eligible beneficiaries were also issued KCC. 1000 works under MGNREGA, District Capex, 14th FC and other schemes were also started during the day.
