

DC Udhampur chairs public grievances redressal camp at Block Majalta



UDHAMPUR, JULY 20: Deputy Commissioner, Udhampur, Krittika Jyotsna today visited block Majalta and listened to scores of public issues and demands at a public outreach programme held under the weekly Block diwas Programme.

BDC Chairman, Dina Nath; DDC Councilor Majalta, Amit Sharma; Sarpanches, Panches and general public of adjoining panchayats projected several demands and problems being faced by them. They sought sanctioning of KV School at Majalta, meeting shortage of drinking water in the area, Providing Ambulance facility, filling up of vacant posts in health and education departments, registration of left out eligible beneficiaries under PMAY, payment of pending material liabilities under MGNREGA, meeting shortage of staff in HSS Majalta, Maintenance of road from Majalta morh to Majalta, Upgradation of GMS Shatrari to High School, organising awareness camps, construction of bridge over local nallah at Majalta, implementation of JJM, streamlining of public delivery system in govt offices, renovation of PMGSY and PWD roads etc.

The DC gave a patient hearing to the public issues and passed on-spot directions to the concerned departments for redressing of public grievances at the earliest. She assured the general public that more such public outreach camps would be organized e to solve the genuine problems of the people at their doorsteps. BDC Chairman, DDC member and general public thanked DC for holding a public outreach camp in the area.

Later, the DC visited Mansar and inspected Mali hut and other Back to village, ADP works being executed by RDD. The DC directed the department to expedite the progress for time bound completion of the works.

JAMMU, JULY 20: To get first-hand account of the public grievances, Deputy Commissioner, Avny Lavasa today presided over the weekly Block Divas programme here at Nagrota. Delegations from different Panchayats, besides scores of individuals apprised her about the problems faced being by them in day to day life.

The main issues highlighted during the programme were related to irregular supply of water and electricity, Revenue, land compensation, road connectivity, cleanliness and sanitation in the area.

The DC gave a patient hearing to the delegations and passed on the spot directions to the concerned officers for early redressal of their genuine grievances. She assured that the highlighted issues of public importance would be taken up with higher authorities besides all the pendency and public service delivery slackness shall be reviewed thoroughly.

She also impressed upon the officers to work with zeal to ensure the delivery of all basic services to the rural masses. She said that the motive of convening Block Diwas was to reach out to the people and understand their problems.

Block Diwas held at Thyan-Kalaroose, Nutnussa-Handwara, Nachiyan- Karnah

KUPWARA, JULY 20: The District Development Commissioner (DDC) Kupwara, Khalid Jahangir today chaired a Mega Block Diwas function at Thayan Kalaroose to hear the public issues.

DDC Member Kalaroos, Ghulam Mustafa; ACD Kupwara, CEO, DSWO, Executive Engineers of R&B, PDD, I&FC; DSHO, AD Food, AD Fisheries, BDO, BMO, block officers, besides, PRIs and people in large number participated in the block diwas.

Addressing the function, the DDC said that some cases of Covid-19 have again emerged recently in J&K UT and appealed to the people to adopt Covid appropriate behaviour by wearing mask, maintaining social distance and using hand hygiene to prevent themselves from spreading the pandemic disease.

Referring to the plastic waste, the DDC stressed the need for eradication of the use of plastic from our daily lives adding that it poses a severe risk of pollution to our water bodies, forests and ecosystem and asked the people to use cloth bags for carrying groceries and other stuff to protect the environment. He directed the PRIs to make added efforts in complete eradication of the plastic waste from their villages as the use of plastic is now banned at national level. He also directed them to make efforts for conservation of water bodies.

Referring to enrollment under Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSSs), the DDC asked PRIs to identify the people in their areas who are yet to get enrolled under various CSSs including Golden Card, Soil Health Card, PMSBY, PMJJY, Aadhaar seeding for their registration at established Aadhaar enrollment centres.

Regarding employment generation, the DDC appealed to educated unemployed youth to come forward and take benefit under different Government schemes for establishment of income generating units like Bulk Milk Coolers, Walnut processing, Sheep farming and like sectors to earn their livelihood.

The DDC stressed upon the district and sectoral officers to work in a mission mode and ensure timely disposal of the public grievances and completion of developmental works.

DDC Member also spoke on the occasion. Earlier, PRIs and senior citizens spoke and put forth their day to day developmental issues of their concerned areas. The DDC heard them patiently and directed the concerned officers for disposal of the issues raised.

The Block Diwas programme was also held at BDO Office Nutnussa under the chairmanship of ADC Handwara, Nazir Ahmad Mir. SDM Karnah, Dr. Gulzar Ahmad Rather also chaired block diwas at Nachiyan Karnah.

The PRIs and general public participated in the block diwas programmes and projected their developmental issues before the officers of the administration. The officers heard their issues patiently and various issues were resolved on the spot.

Special Gram Sabhas for clearance of Forest Rights Claims held in 10 blocks of Kupwara

983 cases approved by FRC, forwarded to SDLFC

KUPWARA, JULY 20: On the directions of Deputy Commissioner, Kupwara, Khalid Jahangir, special Gram Sabhas envisaged for clearance of pending Forest Rights claims were held in 10 Blocks of 3 Forest Divisions of Kupwara district.

The Gram Sabhas were conducted from July 1st to 17th with full participation of general public of these blocks which include Hyhama, Nutnussa, Kalaroose, Sogam, Wavoora, Machill, Qadirabad, Rajwar, Magam and Qalamabad During the course of Gram Sabhas, 2138 cases including 1838 IFRC and 300 CFR were discussed. Of these, 1155 cases were rejected at FRC level and 983 cases including 760 IRFC and 223 CFRC have been approved and forwarded to the Sub Divisional Level Forest Committee (SDLFC) for examination and further recommendation to the District Level Committee.

The Deputy Commissioner Kupwara has issued directions to all Sub Divisional Level Forest Committees to clear all cases duly approved by FRC within 15 days and submit the same to District Level Committee for issuance of rights to the eligible beneficiaries.

Mega Block devas held at 3 blocks of Kulgam



KULGAM, JULY 20: The District Administration Kulgam today organized Mega Block Diwas in three blocks of the district to take appraisal of the public issues, grievances and demands.

During the programme functions were held at Devsar, Kulgam and D. H. Pora blocks of the district.

Officers and officials from line departments listened to issues, grievances and demand of the public for timely redressal at all the three venues.

PRI members and officers from District administration were also present during this block Diwas. A Delegation of people from Behibagh demanded macadamisation on the rest part of Mohamadpora to Behibagh. Public from Redwani demanded proper desilting of irrigation canal and Development of road.

Similarly, residents from Kulgam demanded development of a park in Bungam and establishment of a High school in the main town.

Also, people from several other areas also flagged various demands and put forth their issues for early redressal.

A delegation from Ashthal demanded Flood protection bund on the veshow river whe locals from other area also put forth their issues and demands to the Deputy Commissioner for redressal. Officers on the spot responded to the queries and demands of people pertaining to their departments.

The DC after giving patient hearing to the public, addressed scores of issues of immediate nature. Meanwhile grievances redressal camps were also organised at Block Devsar and D.H.Pora where officers remained available to listen and redress the issues and grievances of people.
